Re: M50 westbound junction 1 to junction 2 resurfacing

I'm writing to inform you of some upcoming maintenance works on the M50, near Pendock. This work will be carried out by our contractor, Kier, on our behalf.

What we're doing and why? What are the benefits?

We'll be resurfacing the M50 westbound between junction 1 and junction 2. The work has been identified following the deterioration of the carriageway. We'll also be replacing the road markings and road studs. The completed work will provide a smoother surface and safer road, including clearer road markings.

When will this work take place?

We'll work from **8 March 2021** to **24 April 2021**. Our work will be carried out overnight when traffic counts are lower, **Monday to Friday**. To reduce disruption to our customers, the work will be delivered in phases as follows;

Phase 1, we'll work from **8 March** to **14 April**. This will include full overnight closures of the M50 westbound between M5 junction 8 and M50 junction 2. Between 8 March and 20 March our closures will be in place Monday to Thursday, 9pm to 6am, and Friday, 10pm to 7am. Between 22 March and 14 April our closures will be in place Monday to Friday, 8pm to 6am.

Phase 2, we'll work from **14 April** to **24 April**. This will include full overnight closures of the M50 westbound between junction 2 and junction 3, Monday to Friday, 8pm to 6am. We need to close the road at this location, as our carriageway resurfacing runs approximately 1km along the M50 westbound from junction 2.


There may be occasional lane closures in place throughout the day to allow the surface temperature to cool, if required. No traffic management in place over the East Bank Holiday weekend (Friday 2 April to Monday 5 April)

As part of our Road Investment Strategy 2 (RIS2): 2020-2025, we'll continue to invest in the M50. There are additional works due to be carried out at this location along the M50 eastbound junction 2 to junction 1. We envisage these works are likely to start around May 2021. We'll write to customers again nearer the time, and provide updates using our M50 traffic management updates and bulletins.

What does this mean for you

During closures, we'll provide a fully signed diversion route- please see the reverse of this page for further details. Emergency vehicles will have access throughout. Our

planned road work may be subject to change due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

We'll make every effort to carefully manage noise levels and additional lighting to minimise the impact. All our sites have strict safeguarding measures to prevent the spread of COVID19 and none of our sites are open to the public. All major construction projects are closely monitored, and the situation is kept under constant review
